

## **OTHER DISCIPLINARY POLICIES**

### Acceptable Use Policy:

Communications or depictions through e-mail, text messages, or web site postings, whether they occur on the PSR computer network or through private communications, which:

- (1) are of a sexual nature;
- (2) threaten, libel, slander, malign, disparage, harass, or embarrass members of the parish school of religion (PSR) community;
- (3) in the teacher's and/or coordinator's discretion cause harm to the parish school of religion (PSR) or the PSR community (collectively "Inappropriate Electronic Conduct");

shall be subject to the full range of disciplinary consequences, including withdrawal for cause, as described in Section 4302, Serious Disciplinary Consequences which includes suspension or expulsion from the PSR program.

### Search & Seizure Policy:

Lockers, desks, etc. are school property and as such are subject to search by school officials. Additionally, a student's jacket, purse, backpack and the like are personal property which may be searched upon reasonable grounds to justify the search. Reasonable grounds to search exist when the school has knowledge of specific and describable conduct leading a reasonable person to believe the student has engaged in prohibited conduct – for example, drugs or weapons. If reasonable grounds exist, the best practice is for school officials to request that a student empty the contents of pockets, purse, and/or backpack. If the student refuses, disciplinary action such as suspension could be taken based on that refusal, or if the school remains convinced of the reasonable grounds for a search of the student's personal property, the school official may conduct a reasonable search notwithstanding the student's refusal. Parents will be notified of the search and results of the seizure, if any.
