Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I hope that you are doing well and have enjoyed the tremendous weather this week. God has a way of offering that extra lift to our spirits when there is so much tension in our lives.

At the time I write this we are scheduled to have a Holy Hour on Friday evening for peace and unity. By the time you are reading this, hopefully it was well attended and full of prayer. The problem of division stemming from hatred between people goes all the way back to the first people. Hatred between people over race goes back pretty far as well. Who is unaware that our country has a very wounded past from its use of slavery? Racism has fueled violence against Black Americans since our founding. Sadly, in reaction there have sometimes been episodes of retaliation against White Americans too. Most of us are caught in the middle. We have to admit that there are deep wounds founded in the terrible injustice of slavery, and because of systematic degradation of black people these have never fully healed. At the same time we have to peacefully stress that this in no way justifies violence today. The George Floyd killing is atrocious. The riots however are not going to be the solution to harmonize society. The only answer is to be found in the mercy of Jesus Christ. His answer to hatred was to allow Himself to be the target of hatred, to allow Himself to answer for sin when He Himself was sinless. As a church, we are called to begin our imitation of Christ in prayer. I would also encourage acts of penance for our nation. There might be the temptation to say, "I am not guilty of causing any of this. Why do I need to fast or do penance?" To that I would say, "You are invited to give yourself for your brothers and sisters in this way, because you are able to understand that peace of Christ that is founded on eternal life. It is not realistic to wait for those who are moved to violence to speak of peace, and if we wait for more to be on the receiving end of violence we have waited too long. If you will not make a sacrifice then who will? The foundation for forgiveness to take place has to be Christ and His victory...and you know of His victory, so your heart is capable of receiving Him." Let us make some hidden sacrifices so that others in pain on both sides may receive hidden grace, as we become the doorway for Christ to enter the conversation in our society.

In other news, Jesus Christ will taking a tour around our campus this coming Corpus Christi Sunday (June 14) in our 7 pm procession! Please join us for this historic and prayerful devotion. It is always a wonderfully spiritual way to begin summer. We profess as Catholics that Jesus meant what He said in the fullness at the Last Supper when He broke bread and shared the chalice with His disciples: "This is my Body.... This is the Chalice of My Blood." Let us keep the Feast!

God bless you and be safe and if you can – join us for Mass – in person or online. You may watch and come up for Communion. But let His love fill your hearts and let us bring a fresh breath of His Spirit to our fragmented society. Peace in the Risen Christ,

From the first letter to Serapion by Saint Athanasius, bishop

Light, radiance and grace are in the Trinity and from the Trinity

It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name.

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energizing reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the holy Trinity is preserved. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is *above all things and through all things* and in all things. God is above all things as Father, for he is principle and source; he is through all things through the Word; and he is in all things in the Holy Spirit.

Writing to the Corinthians about spiritual matters, Paul traces all reality back to one God, the Father, saying: *Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone.*

Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: *My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him.* For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too are its power and its resplendent grace.

This is also Paul's teaching in his second letter to the Corinthians: *The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.* For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit. But when we share in the Spirit, we possess the love of the Father, the grace of the Son and the fellowship of the Spirit himself.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. Everyone ministering to minors and vulnerable adults (clergy, employees and volunteers) in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system by **December 31, 2020**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct.
